THE POWER OF EXAMPLE (John 13:31-35)

At the moment of his pending betrayal, Jesus declared his glorification (i.e., his coming reputation) Love was the means that raised the status of crucifixion from the profane to the sacred. In the cross, Jesus showed God's love to the world through self-giving.

When Jesus was no longer with his followers ,how could God's glory continue to shine? Through the love of his followers. Love united the community in one mind and heart; it united the community to God .

Love is the best way we as Christians can evangelize others The way we treat others speaks volumes about our faith and invites others to join us. Love, even in the smallest of measures, is the best way to spread the glory of Go. The three aspects of general ministry are the roles of priest, prophet, and king. As priests, all Christians are called to pray. As prophets, all Christians are called to witness for Jesus through their words and actions. As kings, all Christians are called to lead others as Jesus did, through loving service. (CCC 941, 942, 943)

All Christians are called to witness by example. The example of prayer, word and deed, and loving service Jesus gave an example of God's presence in the world. We are to continue that example. The love Jesus gives us is the same love we share with others. That love defines us and motivates us. It is the love that grows beyond words.
