THE PHARISEE AND THE TAX COLLECTOR

In today's Gospel First, Jesus tells us that the Pharisee prayed "to himself." How odd! His visit to the Temple to pray was not meant to actually address God, although it began with the words, "O God." He did not make any kind of appeal to God. Even when he expressed gratitude ("I thank You"), it was not thanksgiving for anything in or from God. Instead, the Pharisee was thankful that he was "not like the rest of humanity." He was not "greedy, dishonest, or adulterous." In other words, he practiced virtue, not like "this tax collector." He went on to describe his impressive religious observances—fasting twice a week and paying tithes on his whole income.

This is sobering, isn't it? Here is a religious man who cares deeply about the rules God had given His people, practicing them without fail, but to what has all that led? In his own eyes, he is perfect; he is not a sinner "like the rest of humanity."

Why was the outcast the one who experienced God's mercy and not the religious man? Jesus explains: "Whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and the one who humbles himself will be exalted.

The paradoxical, uncomfortable truth is that we religious people are highly susceptible to self-exaltation, especially in our own day. Many of us believe ourselves to be involved in a "culture war" similar to the one the Pharisees struggled against. Sometimes in our campaigns to preserve morality in our laws and societal norms, we can become self-righteous. We despise sinners, forgetting that we, too, are sinners in great need of God's mercy. This parable serves as a warning to people like us, In our prayers, our pious practices, and our participation in Mass, are we more aware of the sins of others than our own? Do we make the sinners around us feel ostracized and judged? Are we willing to beat our breasts and cry out for God's mercy, knowing how needy we are? -Gayle Somers 'Catholic exchange'

OUR EMERITUS BISHOP BRIAN NOBLE

The Rt Rev Brian Noble, 10th Bishop of Shrewsbury, died peacefully on Monday at the age of 83 years. The Emeritus Bishop was formerly a priest of the Diocese of Lancaster. He was ordained for the Diocese of Shrewsbury in 1995 and he retired in 2010, but continued to be active, giving talks and retreats and assisting in the parishes

The Rt Rev Mark Davies, the Bishop of Shrewsbury, said: "The Shrewsbury Diocese shares a great sadness that Bishop Brian Noble, who was so much part of our lives as priest and bishop, has passed from this world. We will especially remember his example of perseverance through serious illness in his care of this Diocese

with his unfailing dedication and good humour. Conscious of the immense responsibility given to a Bishop, I ask the prayers of all for the eternal and happy repose of his soul."

FUNERAL ARRANGEMENTS



His body will rest before the Altar until the **Vigil Mass at 7.00 pm** His mortal remains will then be transferred to rest overnight at Saint Joseph's, Birkenhead Wednesday 6th November: They will then be transferred to the Church of Saint Michael and All Angels, Birkenhead at 10.00 am where his body will rest before the Altar until the **Requiem Mass at 12.00 Noon** His mortal remains will then be laid to rest at Saint Winefride's Churchyard, Neston at 2.00 pm

YOUTH ZONE

SAINT DOMINIC SAVIO—age 14

St. Dominic Savio died at the age of 14 in 1857 When he was canonized a saint in 1954 by Pope Pius XII, he was (and remains) the youngest person ever to have been canonized a saint by the Catholic Church without being some sort of martyr. He wrote in his journal that he had four rules::

- 1) I will go to Confession often, and as frequently to Holy Communion as my confessor allows.
- 2) I wish to sanctify the Sundays and festivals in a special manner.
- 3) My friends shall be Jesus and Mary.
- 4) Death rather than sin. .
