The lockdown continues and SVP members keep in- touch with beneficiaries by phone and text with the odd "safe distancing" visit. Prison visiting, which used to occur at Berwyn Prison near Wrexham, was stopped at the start of the pandemic. Covid-19 has found its way into prisons but we have no knowledge of occurrences at Berwyn. Prisoners are only allowed out of cells for 1 hour per day and meals are taken to their cells. Catholic leaflets have been produced and are being taken to those men who regularly attended the weekly masses by "Listeners" who are cleared to visit men in prison.

Mental issues have risen and calls to the Samaritans increased. BT have reduced the cost of calling home and each man is given £5 to call their families. The loss of social contact exacerbates any mental problems. Do keep these men in your prayers. God bless Steve
