JUNE IS DEDICATED TO 'THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS'



Consider the action of the Holy Spirit in the life of the believer and of the Church: How beautiful is the thought that the Holy Spirit lives within us! Saint Paul reminds the Corinthian community of this fact when he asks, "Do you not know that you are God's temple and that God's Spirit dwells in you?" (I Cor 3:16) It is the Holy Spirit who develops our

intimacy with God. "God has sent the Spirit of His Son into our hearts crying, 'Abba!' ('Father!')" (Gal 4:6). "God's love has been poured into our hearts by the

Holy Spirit Who has been given to us" (Rom5:5). "No one can say, 'Jesus is Lord,' except by the Holy Spirit" (I Cor12:3). Preparing for the reopening of Churches:-There will be a 2 stage opening of churches ie stage 1 is opening for private prayer and stage 2 is opening for Masses etc; each Church has to nominate a Covid 19 Safety Lead and stewards facilitating the opening.
