When it is time in the Mass for the Blessing of Ashes, you will please hold up your cards, and they will be blessed together. The Mass will proceed in the normal way, with Holy Communion as you leave. This way, everyone receives blessed Ashes for Ash Wednesday but there is no physical contact between Priest and Recipient". This week perhaps I could point you towards the SVP national website where is reports on many matters including in 2017 the setting up of the Famvin Global Initative. This is a world wide group of organisations inspired by the 2m SVP members. The alliance tackles homelessness globally and the report covers the 13 houses campaign which had the objective of providing homes for 10,000 people within 5 years. 54

collaborative projects in 40 countries have presently provided 1263 homes for 5281 people in 40 countries including England and Wales.
