We have before us a beautiful moment of grace open to us, when we follow our blessed Lord through the Way of the Cross promises answers to the deep questions thrown at us daily by the challenges of life and its crosses.

POPE FRANCIS LENTEN MESSAGE (extracts)

Fasting:, In embracing the experience of poverty, those who fast make themselves poor In this way, fasting helps us to love God and our neighbour, inasmuch as love, focuses our attention on others and considers them as one with ourselves

Hope: In these times of trouble, , it may appear challenging to speak of hope. Yet Lent is precisely the season of hope, Saint Paul urges us to place our hope in reconciliation: "Be reconciled to God" (2 Cor 5:20). By receiving forgiveness in the sacrament we in turn can spread forgiveness to others., we can offer it through our willingness to enter into attentive dialogue with others and to give comfort to those experiencing sorrow and pain.

Love: Love rejoices in seeing others grow. Hence it suffers when others are anguished, lonely, sick, homeless, despised or in need. Love is a gift that gives meaning to our lives. It enables us to view those in need as members of our own family, as friends, brothers or sisters. A small amount, if given with love, never ends

<u>TIMELY REMINDERS</u> Public Health England reminded us of greater transmissibility of the new variants. We must remain vigilant to avoid transmission via touch (cleaning of surfaces and hand cleansing has been underlined); mitigation against droplets (face coverings) and ensuring continued good ventilation and air flow in sacred spaces, so our churches will remain safe
