A NEW CONTEXT (Lk 24:35-4)

In this Sunday's Gospel as witnesses, the early disciples were charged to tell others what they saw. We too are called to share what we have seen, heard, and touched with others. Witness involves speaking the truth in love. . The cost of this endeavour is high for it leads to the cross. The reward is that much greater, for it leads to the resurrection.

This Sunday added a new element to the disciples' vision experience: a context for understanding. We, like most Christians, are tempted to take the context for granted. The Good News might become the old news. To shake off this inclination, let us place ourselves in the company of those who first heard the words of the two from Emmaus.

Better yet, let us place ourselves in the company of those who evangelize others by word and deed. Let us walk with those who serve the poor and needy in the name of Christ. Let us walk with those who serve the children or those outsiders who seek Christ. In the mere process of being witness, the context comes alive.
