Today the Church's proclamation echoes throughout the world: "Jesus Christ is risen!" – "He is truly risen." In this night, the Church's voice rings out: "Christ, my hope, is

ST CLARE'S SVP CONFERENCE

This quarter's Vincentian Concern included financial and activity details for the SVP in England and Wales in 2019/20. Interestingly income increased from the previous year to £14m mainly through donations and legacies whilst expenditure rose to £11m. 405700 visits were made and £734,749 donated to overseas projects.

There were 853 requests for help from National Office and material help was given on 83,600 occasions. 10,000 items of furniture were delivered through the network of furniture stores. Volunteers gave over 600,000 hours of help. There were 629 Mini Vinnie groups such as the one at our Primary School and 100 youth groups (11-14) and 21 B-attitude groups (14.18). St Clare's Church 2020/21 report will be forthcoming after Easter when the figures are resolved. Happy Easter all and keep safe and well. God bless. Steve

The Stations of the Cross, created by pupils, were displayed around the school hall and classes were able to participate at their own level. There was a wonderfully prayerful atmosphere created in the hall, pupils were totally engaged. On Tuesday staff in school joined a Lenten Reflection for school staff led by the Diocese.

Our winning school house this half term, with eleven points, was 'Mother Teresa', so the jubilant pupils from the winning house enjoyed making Easter crispy cakes. All pupils enjoyed an Easter egg treasure hunt. We were spoilt with eggs this year, so we were able to play Easter Bingo with many pupils winning egg prizes!

Recently, Fr Emeka met with staff from St Clare's to discuss the restart of Sacramental preparation. We are delighted that so many of our families are keen for their children to receive

the Sacraments of Forgiveness and Holy Communion for the first time and we have tentatively pencilled in dates to the school calendar.

All the staff and pupils in St Clare's Catholic Primary School wish our parishioners a very happy, healthy and holy Easter. We are all very much looking forward to the day we can gather as a whole school in church again.
