Today, we celebrate the

solemn feast of Corpus Christi. It is three feasts in one: the feast of the Eucharistic sacrifice, feast of the Sacrament of the Eucharist and the feast of the Real Presence of Jesus. It is a doctrinal feast established for three purposes: 1) to give God collective thanks for Christ's abiding presence with us in the Eucharist and to honor him there; 2) to instruct the people in the Mystery, Faith and devotion surrounding the Eucharist, and 3) to teach us to appreciate and make use of the great

gift of the Holy Eucharist, both as a Sacrament and as a sacrifice.

PROMISES BY OUR LADY TO ST DOMINIC TO THOSE WHO PRAY THE ROSARY

- 1. Whoever shall faithfully serve me by the recitation of the Rosary, shall receive signal graces.

- 3. It shall be powerful armour against hell. It will destroy vice, decrease sin and defeat heresies.
- 4. It will cause virtue and good works to flourish. It will obtain for souls the abundant mercy of God. It will withdraw the hearts of men from the love of the world and its vanities, and will lift them to the desire of eternal things. Oh, that souls would sanctify themselves by this means.
- 5. The soul which recommends itself to me by the recitation of the Rosary, shall not perish.
- 6. Whoever shall recite the Rosary devoutly, applying himself to the consideration of its sacred mysteries, shall never be conquered by misfortune. God will not chastise him in His justice.
