Chester and Wrexham SVP conferences and Parishes did take part. St Werburgh's Father Paul Shaw regularly said mass there.

The restarted masses are without the usual refreshments and after mass chat. The lockdown and track and trace has added to prisoners' frustrations and fights and other such problems have occurred: also lack of staff. All those housed and working in prisons need our prayers.
