THE TOUCH OF THE LORD Mk 7:31-37



We should never despair of the power of God. No soul is too hardened to be penetrated by Christ's love and forgiveness; the greatest sinners often make the greatest saints. Though someone appears deaf to the Word of Life and unable to respond to the invitations of the Holy Spirit, our confidence must never be shaken, for Jesus "makes the deaf hear and the dumb speak." This applies even to the lives of believers. Often we

seem to be stuck in our spiritual lives, unable to advance, incapable of overcoming certain defects or sinful habits. Sometimes this discourages us, and we slack off in our efforts to practice self-discipline and to live a vibrant life of prayer. That's when the devil can make a bold move on us, luring us into a relationship or an activity that actually obstructs the flow of God's grace in our lives. Precisely then, when we seem to have reached a spiritual plateau, we need to let Christ take us "away from the crowd" (perhaps on a retreat) to renew our interior hearing. His power is never lacking, but our faith oftentimes is. - *Fr. John Bartunek, LC*
