<u>BEATIFICATION OF SISTER CLARE CROCKETT</u>: 1982 – 2016. Sr Clare was a truly inspirational young "Derry girl" from Northern Ireland, a self-confessed "superficial wild child", who, to the amazement of her family, became a Nun in Spain. She tragically died in an earthquake in Ecuador, aged 33. On Sunday 12<sup>th</sup> January the Beatification process formally opened with a ceremony at the Cathedral of Alcalá de Henares in Madrid, Spain, as reported here:
